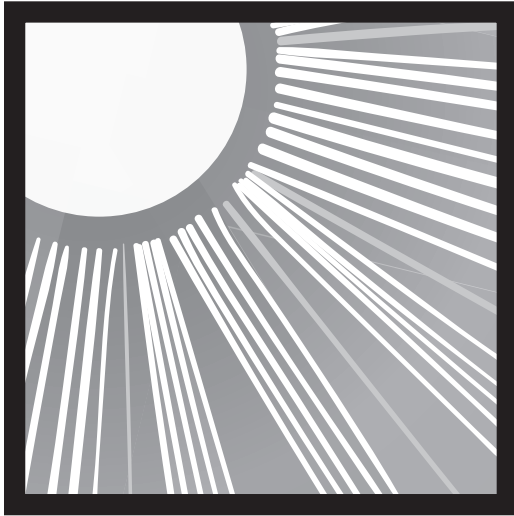

10 Fashion Shows & Costume Contest

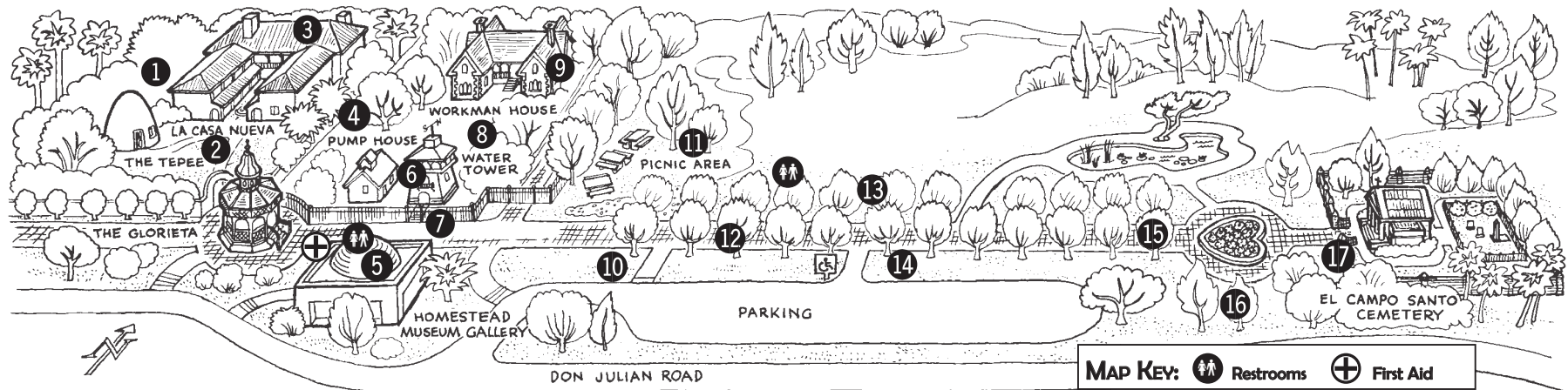
